Introduction

Overview in brief

Trailers are used extensively both in and outside work. Our course is designed to support you to towing trailers safely both for work and/or for leisure (such as caravans, boats and horse boxes). You will need to operate your trailer both on and off road for this assessed course to achieve your certificate.



The finer details



Your course sessions will include:

- Legal requirements towing on-road
- Weight limitations on and/or off road
- Types of trailer and hitch suitability for purpose and limitations of use
- Causes of accidents
- Coupling/un-coupling procedures
- On and/or off road trailer towing
- Loading effects on stability/control
- Vehicle/trailer checks on and/or off road
- Braking exercise on and/or off Road
- Limitations of braking system on and/or off road.

You'll have a practical assessment and will receive a certificate of training when you have completed the course.

Who should attend?

Those wishing to update their skills in trailer towing and/or satisfy health and safety legislation regarding the safe use of trailers at work.

- On Road: anyone required to tow on the road who already holds the relevant driving licence
- Off Road: anyone needing to tow trailers off road as part of their work or for leisure purposes.

What will be covered?

At the end of this course the learner will be able to:

- understand the legal requirements when towing trailers
- carry out equipment safety checks
- understand how the type and weight of a trailer affects on and/or off road performance and safety
- understand the relationship between vehicle and trailer weights and limits and how they are affected by use on and/or off road
- couple/uncouple the trailer from a vehicle
- understand the requirements of driving the vehicle and trailer combination on and/or off
- demonstrate competence in dealing with a variety of on and/or off road situations commonly encountered
- understand the main causes of accidents and what can be done to avoid them.
