## Accredited Training Programme – the main points:

- This is a new programme and all instances of previously approved training courses will not be counted in this new programme which means if a person wants to apply for e.g. business planning course again (which they were previously approved for in the last programme) they will be able to do so.
- The removal of application windows in the new programme. The application page will be open on BOSS / Business Wales at all times , this will hopefully make is easier for people to apply for a training course and for those assisting them. All being well the plan is to open the application page at 9am Monday 15<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
- Approximately 70 courses added initially more in due course especially focusing on land management.
- To apply is a 2 step process via the Business Wales (BOSS) website
  - 1. Complete a Personal Development Plan
  - 2. Submit an application for a training course
- Applications submitted in one month will be approved at the beginning of the following month with applicants potified within 10 working days.

## Accredited Training Programme – the main points

- Eligible FC clients can be approved for 3 training courses within 12 months (please note only 1 machinery and equipment related course in a 12 month period and only 1 pesticides course per business per annum).
- A Google doc will be produced which will be shared with development officers and training providers providers will be responsible for updating the doc information required will be course title, date and venue this will help clients make a more informed choice when applying for a funded training course.
- In readiness for the new programme the Farming Connect website will be updated with new courses and providers and key information.
- The user guide will be updated and available by the 15<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
- The Business Wales (BOSS) Website (where people log onto to apply) will be updated with the necessary information.
